6. DRAFT PROGRAMMATIC ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (PEIR) PUBLIC REVIEW MEETING

Environmental Science Associates (ESA) Kelley Sterle made a presentation regarding the Draft PEIR for the Groundwater Sustainability Plan currently available for public review and comment that included an overview of the following:

- Funding for this work Proposition 68
- Purpose of the public workshop and how input can be provided
- GSP background
- Turlock Subbasin study area
- California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review is not required for the development/adoption of a GSP; however, it is required for implementation of GSP projects and management actions. A program-level CEQA document is the most appropriate to streamline these activities.
- Statement of objectives are to intended to avoid undesirable results and achieve sustainability goal
- Project definition physically constructed features
- Definition of management actions no-structural programs
- Scope of PEIR
- Environmental analysis
- Alternatives analysis (1, 2, & 3)
- Next steps in the CEQA process
- CEQA schedule NOP released on January 7, 2022; Draft EIR published on July 27, 2022; Final EIR scheduled to be certified in early 2023
- Public comment period started on July 27, 2022 and ends on September 12, 2022
- Methods for reviewing the Draft PEIR and submitting comments

Member of the public Walt Ward expressed concern regarding alternative analysis 3 related to direct and in-lieu recharge.

ESA's Kelley Sterle and Meredith Parkin provided brief comment in response to public comment clarifying the thought behind developing different CEQA alternatives for the PEIR.

Member of the public Peter Drekmeier questioned the impact of diverting additional water from the Tuloumne River.

ESA's Kelley Sterle and Meredith Parkin provided brief comment in response to public comment clarifying that the PEIR focuses on evaluating implementation of the GSP and not other policy issues. WTS GSA TAC Chair Cooke further clarified that the Bay Delta Plan and fish flows will be addressed as part of the permitting requirements for projects and management actions.
